

Kinghome Dolphin 40 Compliance and Performance Issues

Overview of Kinghome Dolphin 40

The [Kinghome Dolphin 40](#) is marketed as a heat pump system with specific heating and cooling capacities. However, a closer review of its published specifications and reported performance raises serious concerns regarding regulatory compliance, accuracy of ratings, and legality in certain markets.

Published Specifications

The unit lists key details such as voltage, cooling and heating capacity, power input, and efficiency ratings. While these figures appear standard at first glance, inconsistencies in efficiency metrics and missing required values suggest incomplete or misleading disclosures.

Failure to Meet DOE Minimum Efficiency Requirements

The Kinghome Dolphin 40 does not meet the minimum efficiency standards required by the Department of Energy (DOE). Units in this category must comply with specific SEER2 and HSPF2 benchmarks. The absence of valid ratings indicates that the system may not legally qualify for sale or installation.

Missing or Incorrect Efficiency Ratings

A critical issue is the lack of a verified SEER2 rating. Instead, alternative metrics such as EER and COP are presented, which are not sufficient for regulatory compliance in this product category. This omission alone can render the unit non-compliant with federal guidelines.

Illegal Rating Practices

The use of incorrect efficiency metrics instead of mandated standards is considered a violation. Heat pumps must be evaluated using approved testing procedures, and failure to provide these ratings indicates improper classification and reporting.

Misclassification Concerns

The Kinghome Dolphin 40 appears to be misclassified under regulatory definitions. Proper classification determines which standards apply, and any deviation from correct categorization can lead to non-compliance with federal regulations.

Miscalculated Performance Numbers

Performance values for both cooling and heating appear to be inaccurately calculated. Reported outputs and efficiency ratios do not align with the provided power inputs, suggesting errors or manipulation in performance data.

Cooling Performance Issues

- Claimed cooling capacity does not align with power consumption
- Efficiency ratios appear inflated
- Calculated results differ from published values

Heating Performance Issues

- Heating capacity figures are inconsistent
- COP values seem overstated
- Data does not match expected engineering calculations

Fraudulent and Fabricated Data Concerns

There are indications that the performance data may not be based on verified laboratory testing. Fabricated or simulated results violate regulatory requirements and undermine product credibility.

Regulatory Non-Compliance

The product does not adhere to established testing and certification standards. Non-compliance includes failure to meet DOE requirements, improper labeling, and lack of validated performance data.

False Representation of Product Capabilities

Publishing incorrect efficiency ratings and performance claims can mislead consumers and stakeholders. Misrepresentation includes overstating energy efficiency and providing incomplete or inaccurate technical details.

Legal Implications

Non-compliance with federal regulations can result in legal consequences, including penalties, restrictions on distribution, and liability for misleading claims. Manufacturers and distributors may face enforcement actions if violations are confirmed.

Restrictions on Distribution and Use

Due to failure in meeting required standards, the Kinghome Dolphin 40 may be considered ineligible for legal sale, installation, or use in regulated markets. Compliance with verified testing and certification is mandatory for approval.
