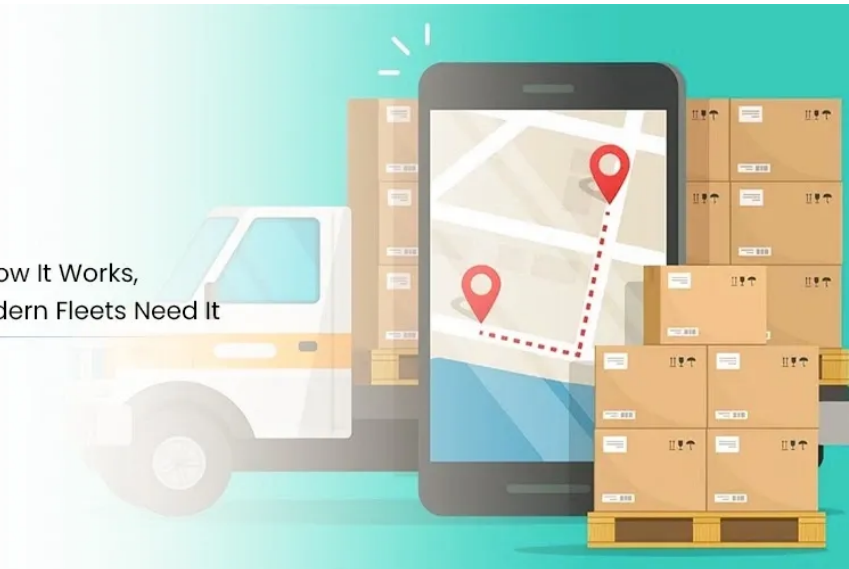




Truck Routing Software: How It Works, What It Does, and Why Modern Fleets Need It

The Core Technology Behind It

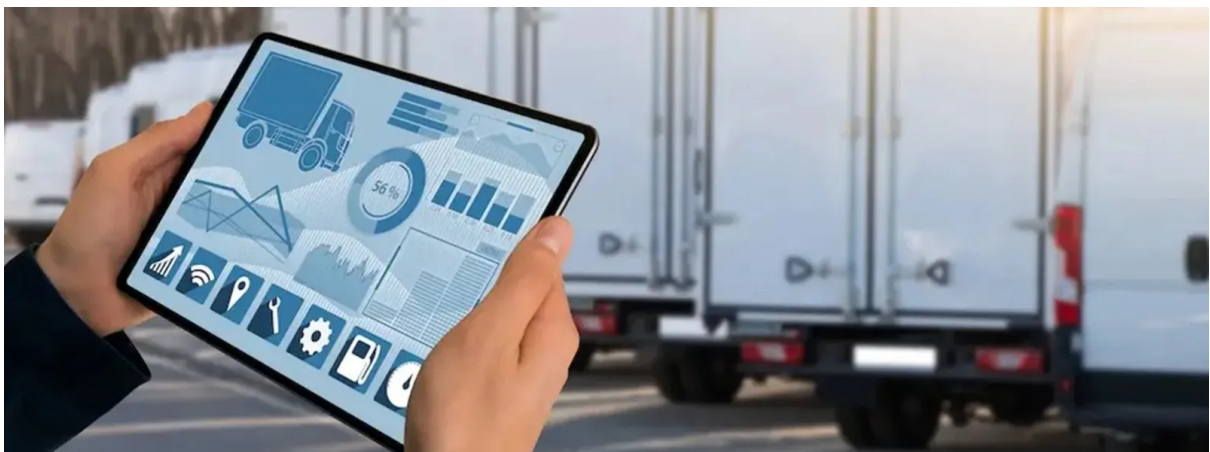
Modern truck routing tools rely on three main technologies working together:
